## **Steve and Dawn, Jemima, Max and Zebedee Orange in Belgium**



## What's the Need?

French speaking Belgium epitomises the spiritual battlefield that is continental Europe: largely secular and resistant to the Gospel of Christ. Despite a long history of minority Protestant witness, only a tiny number would regularly enter a church where the Bible is opened and explained. The need for gospel workers remains great in Belgium, not least gospel workers from the Belgian harvest field itself.

The evangelical church of Woluwé St Lambert in Brussels is a small but growing congregation, planted in the early 1980's. It is well placed to reach out to a nearby university and to the large EC and business district: two communities largely untouched by Belgian protestant churches.

## Why Steve and Dawn?

Following years of involvement in a large church in London, Steve and Dawn were involved in student ministry in French speaking Belgium between 2001-04. Dur-

ing this period of ministry, they were members of the Woluwé church, and since then they have maintained strong links with the congregation, making frequent visits back to the church during Steve's recent theological studies at Oak Hill Theological College (2004-06) and then at the Faculté Libre de Théologie Évangélique de Vaux-sur-Seine, Paris (2006-07).

Following this final year of theological training and immersion in French culture and language Steve and Dawn are looking forward to returning to the church in Woluwé where Steve will be actively involved in the church's leadership. He will be an 'elder in training', preaching and leading services, whilst developing new and existing ministries. Together Steve and Dawn share a concern with the church that families and students in Brussels are given the opportunity to respond to the good news of Jesus Christ and be discipled in the church. Longer term, they would love to see more Belgian co-workers being discipled, trained and equipped by the local church for word ministry, and so sent out into the harvest field.
