2. As Crosslinks mission partners Glenn and Lizzy Nesbitt prepare to move back to the UK, pray for them as they finish up their work in South Africa. Ask that Glenn's final term of lecturing at Johannesburg Bible College would be one of growth and change for staff and students and that Lizzy would continue to be consistent in her witness, and an encouraging influence at St John's College.
3. Martins and Miroslavs from Paraugava Reformed Church in Riga, Latvia will be in the UK at the start of May. Please ask for them to be bolstered and encouraged by their existing partnerships, pray that they would form new partnerships whilst they are in the UK and that the ministry of Paraugava church to students and local residents would be sustainable long term.
4. The next Crosslinks Board of Trustees meeting will be held on 18 May. Pray for those attending that they would make wise decisions in all that is put before them, driven by a desire to glorify God and make his Word known.
5. Crosslinks project Discipling the Next Generation has been training Rwandans to teach the Bible to children through their Kids Bible Club in Kigali. Give thanks for those who have attended, including Ange and Alexandre, and the work they have been able to do with children at their church's Sunday Schools as a result of this training. Please pray that Discipling the Next Generation would continue to provide a better learning platform for many, that it would receive the support of many Rwandan church leaders and that it would grow many effective Sunday School leaders, both now and in years to come.
6. Give thanks for safety for Kenya Gap Year Team as they return to Nairobi from an exhausting but profitable time in the Samburu region working with hundreds of children and young people on camp. Please pray they would now be able to rest well and have safe travel back to the UK on 21 May.
