We saw growth and change in each of them over the six months, particularly in confidence in discussing Scripture and even preaching from the front. Our graduation at the end of June was attended by over 200 guests!

The mission to Samburu went well despite challenges of space for sleeping and living in very close proximity, in addition to the other usual challenges faced each year. The team led the children's camp (around 300 children) and youth camp (around 80) which gave them good experience to teach, be leaders and communicate the gospel. They also did outreach into local communities so it was great for all of them to engage with different cultures; this year we had three

young men from Samburu in our programme. In a male-dominated culture it is exciting to influence these young men to be serious, committed Christians.

This year we introduced a new type of teaching, specifically supported by one of our partner churches. We had copies of 'God's Big Picture', a book by Vaughn Roberts which the group read chapter by chapter. They had teaching on the topic, then read the chapter, then completed the bible study materials in small groups. We were particularly excited that one of the young men, Fredrick, from Samburu, requested a copy of the book to keep so that when he returned to Samburu he could teach it to other people. He found it enlightening to understand the Bible as one story.

Around 10 of TransformD are beginning university in September. Others will look for further training at colleges for things like hospitality or agriculture and some will look for jobs.

We hope that within the next couple of months we will have some permanent full-time staff to help Gerald, which will make continuity easier. Particularly running alumni events, keeping in contact and supporting the young people beyond the programme. Gerald will be thinking through how to do this well and planning for the future with these other staff members. Please pray for the necessary resources to this end. Then in December we will run another 'Cross Camp' for 40 young people at iServe premises. We also hope to be back in Northern Ireland during September for a few weeks.

They will all be moving on: Peter to theological education supported by Crosslinks' BEST programme, Alex seeking to begin theological education and Anisia looking for work.
- Give thanks for our baby twins and other families in our church who have had firstborns within a few months of ours. Some are due soon. We are very grateful for our growing church plant and the friends we have made there.
- Please pray for the TransformD participants as they move on to the next stage, particularly for those with challenges at home and the financial pressures of looking for education fees. Pray that as they all move on they would stand firm in their faith.
